## FORMER AMBASSADOR TO POLAND TO SPEAK

Ambassador William E. Schaufele, President of the Foreign Policy Association and former U.S. Ambassador to Poland, 1975-1977, will address a joint meeting of the English-Speaking Union and NCIV, co-sponsored by the student Senates of Salve Regina College, on Monday, February 15 at 8:00 pm, at the O'Hare Academic Center.

Ambassador Schaufele is a retired Foreign Service Officer and his other high level appointments include: Member of the U.S. Delegation to the U.N. General Assembly, Deputy U.S. Representative on the U.N. Security Council, Assistant Secretary for African Affairs and Ambassador to the Republic of Upper Volta.

## ADMINISTRATORS AND FACULTY NEWS

Sister Lucille McKillop attended the Annual Meeting of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities in Washington, D. C., February 2-5, 1982. During this period, Sister Lucille, as Treasurer of NAICU, chaired the Finance Committee meeting. Sister Lucille also chaired the New England Regional Committee meeting of NAICU. Sister Lucille has been a member of the Board of Directors of NAICU since 1978.

While in Washington, D. C., as president of the Association of Presidents of Mercy Colleges, Sister Lucille McKillop also chaired the Annual Meeting of the Association. (There are nineteen colleges in the United States sponsored by the Religious Sisters of Mercy.)

Sister Sheila Megley attended the annual meetings of the American Catholic Colleges and Universities, as well as the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities in Washington, D. C. During this period, Sister Sheila, the representative of the Presidents Association of Mercy Colleges, attended the Secretariat Meeting for NAICU. The Secretariat advises NAICU in terms of special interests peculiar to the association of colleges.

Sister Sheila Megley is also a member of the Neylan Commission, a six member executive committee that represents 107 colleges sponsored by religious women. She participated in the planning of the Neylan Commission which is focusing on:

1. A Case Statement for the 107 Colleges.
2. A National Conference for Religious Women interested in Higher Education scheduled for 1983.
3. A National Project to mobilize the resources of the 107 Colleges for instruction via television.

Sister M. Mauricita Stapleton has been invited to participate in a Symposium at Wesleyan University entitled "Knowledge in an Information Era" from February 11 to 13, 1982. The symposium will critically explore issues relating to changes in the ways in which knowledge will be created and disseminated by institutions of our society during the remainder of this century. Speakers for the event are known for their contribution to the field of library and information services.

Dr. Jerome A. Montvilo, Assistant Professor of Biology, and his wife, Robin, have co-authored an article entitled "Effect of Retinal Location on Cone Critical Flicker Frequency". The article is in the 1982 edition of the journal of "Perceptual and Motor Skills."

Although Salve does not have a weightlifting team, the College sponsors Gerry in intercollegiate and NCAA championship competition. Gerry plans to join Salve's track team where he will throw the 35-pound weight and assist other members of the team in developing a weightlifting program. Immediate goals for Gerry include participation in the NCAA weightlifting championship in North Carolina on February 18, the Junior American Championships in Cleveland in March, and the Junior New England Championships in New Bedford in April.

The Salve men's team pulled off its second win of the season, Monday night against Thames Valley Technical College 84-63. Rob Franklin led Salve with 19 points; also scoring in double figures, Jay Morris had 16 points, Brian Lynch, 13 points, and Cliff Carney, 12 points. ## BELIZE EDUCATION PROGRAM

A program has been established with the Sisters of Mercy in Belize for an In-Service training program for the staff of St. Catherine's School in Belize City, Belize. Sister Sheila Megley and Sister Lucille McKillop visited the school in January and worked out the details with the teachers. After consultation with the presidents of the Sixth Form Colleges (Junior Colleges) in Belize, of which there are three in Belize; with School Boards; and with the former Minister of Education, a program has been set up whereby each of the teachers who does not have a bachelor's degree would be able to take another year of college work at Salve Regina College. Salve Regina College will set up classes in Belize which will be taught by Sisters in Belize who have been appointed adjunct professors at the College and by volunteers from the faculty at Salve. These courses will be offered at St. Catherine's School in Belize, and Salve Regina College will offer credit. In addition, Salve Regina College will offer one scholarship per year to teachers prepared for their fourth year of study. The teachers who receive the scholarship will return to teach in Belize at St. Catherine's School for at least two consecutive years.

Sister Caritas will teach the first course which will be the Sociology of Belize. Sister Caritas has her Master's degree from Rhode Island College and has done further graduate work at the University of the West Indies. She has taught in the Teachers College in Belize and, at present is teaching eighth grade at St. Catherine's School. Sister Miriam Clare, M.A., will teach Methods Courses at St. Catherine's School for the College.

The Sisters in Belize, the staff of St. Catherine's School, and even the Belizean Government officials are most grateful for this arrangement.
