SALVE REGINA - THE NEWPORT COLLEGE APPOINTS 15 NEW, FULL-TIME FACULTY MEMBERS

Fifteen new faculty members have been appointed for the 1982-83 academic year at Salve Regina - The Newport College. Three positions in English, two in mathematics, and one position each in art, accounting, chemistry, criminal justice, economics, language and literature, music, nursing, religious studies and biology/sociology were recently filled, bringing to 84 the number of full-time faculty at the College. Appointed were:

ENGLISH - Brother John Coakley, C.F.C., Reverend Paul A. Messer, S.J., and Brother Stephen A. Rusyn, F.S.C. Brother John has a masters degree and Ph.D. in American civilization from Brown University, and also holds a masters degree in English/education from Hunter College in New York. Father Messer is currently completing his doctoral requirements in English from the University of Utah. He holds a masters in English and a bachelor's

degree in theology from Boston College. Father Messer, a member of the Jesuit order, has taught at Boston College, Bishop Connolly High School, Fall River, and Fairfield University, Fairfield, Conn. Brother Stephen has taught previously at St. Raphael's Academy, Pawtucket, and LaSalle Academy, Providence. He holds a masters degree in English from the University of Rhode Island and is currently completing his doctoral requirements there.

MATH - Sister Mary T. O'Malley O.P., and Sheila Duncan. Previously an associate professor of math at Rosary College, Chicago, and a math instructor at high schools in Connecticut and Wisconsin, Sister Mary holds a masters degree in math from Catholic University of America, and a Ph.D. in mathematics education from Columbia University in New York. Sheila Duncan earned a bachelor's degree in math and Russian from Barnard College, New York, and masters degree from Cornell University. She also holds a masters degree from Portland State University, Portland, Ore. Duncan previously worked as a technical writer for a computer firm.

ACCOUNTING - Ann Galligan Kelley. Kelley, a native of Peace Dale, has a masters in business administration from Northeastern University, Boston, and holds a bachelor's degree in business accounting from Providence College. She has taught previously at Northeastern and has served as an accountant and auditor at several Providence firms.

ART - Angelo Marinosci. Marinosci, a Providence resident, was formerly a photography instructor at Rhode Island College and has taught art at the elementary and secondary school levels. He has earned two baccalaureate degrees in art and a masters degree in teaching-art education from Rhode Island College.

BIOLOGY/SOCIOLOGY - Tzighereda Ghebreigziabiker. Ghebreigziabiker has completed requirements for her masters degree in human development at Salve Regina. She holds a bachelor's degree in biology from Immaculata

College, Immaculata, Penn. A native of Ethiopia, Ghebreigziabiker has lectured in biology at the University of Asmara, Asmara, Ethiopia. She will be a teaching assistant in biology and sociology.

CHEMISTRY - Dr. James F. Nugent. Dr. Nugent is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania with a Ph.D. in chemistry. Before accepting his appointment at Salve, he was a process development chemist in Williamsport, Penn. Dr. Nugent also holds a bachelor's degree from Rutgers University.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE - Vincent Petrarca. From West Greenwich, Petrarca holds a masters degree in educational psychology from Ball State University, Muncie, Ind., and a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Rhode Island. He has worked in the area of corrections/law enforcement for several years.

ECONOMICS - John T. Pickett. Pickett holds a bachelor of arts in economics from Boston University and a masters degree in economics from Brown University, where he is currently completing his doctoral requirements. He is a resident of Providence.

LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE - Brother Ralph Bucci, F.S.C. Prior to his appointment at Salve, Brother Ralph was assistant vice principal at LaSalle Academy, Providence, where he also taught Italian, religion and art. He earned a master of arts from Rhode Island College, and a bachelor of arts in Italian literature from Catholic University of America.

MUSIC - Brother James Loxham, F.S.C. Brother James, a Wickford resident, holds a bachelor's degree in music from the University of Rhode Island and bachelor and masters' degrees from Catholic University of America. He will direct the Newport College Singers.

NURSING - Sister Maureen Hynes, O.F.S. Sister Maureen earned a bachelor's degree in education from Mt. Alvernia College, a bachelor of science degree in nursing from Salve Regina, and a master of philosophy

degree from Newton College of the Sacred Heart. She has taught previously in the Catholic Diocesan School System, and the Department of Youth Services, Boston. Sister Maureen is a resident of Newport.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES - Reverend Douglas J. Spina. A graduate of Our Lady of Providence Seminary, Father Spina holds four degrees including the Ph.D., from Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium. He has also served as an instructor of Italian in Tildonic, Belgium. Father Spina previously taught part-time at the College.

Classes for undergraduates at Salve Regina begin Thursday, September 9. Graduate classes begin Monday, September 13.
