Semone Cahill and Alan Leveillee, two reknown public archeologists, recently presented an interesting and educational lecture concerning Paleo-Indian involvement in New England at Salve on February 16 in Angelus Hall.

As public archeologists, Cahill and Leveillee are fully involved in the Public Archeology Laboratory, Inc. in Providence. This group exists in order to locate and study sites that could be helpful in understanding our ancestors.

One site that is their primary interest is the Narrow River Project. Believing that much evidence of Pre-historic human is within the Taunton River Boundaries, the two scientists have come to not only generate enthusiasm, but also to seek help. Salve students have been asked to assist in this study, affording them the practical experience of participating in sophisticated anthropological work. The thrust of preserving, recognizing and documenting the Pre-historic period throughout the Taunton River Area is the purpose of the research.

The Anthropology Department was honored to host Semone Cahill and Alan Leveillee and grateful to be able to participate in the search for Pre-historic occupation.
