SALVE REGINA CHOIRS TO PERFORM WITH WEST POINT GLEE CLUB



The Salve Regina College Choirs will perform in concert with the West Point Glee Club on Friday, October 18 at 8:00 p.m. in the Rogers High School auditorium.

The concert is part of an exchange choral program between the U.S. Military Academy and Salve Regina. The Salve choirs recently returned from a weekend at West Point where they opened the Army-Yale football game by singing the National Anthem with the cadets.

The nationally known West Point Glee Club, conducted by William H. Cosby, will perform such selections as "La Tahara," "Of Thee I Sing," "Armed Forces Medley" and "George M. Cohan Medley." Ruthanne Schempf will be the accompanist.

Under the direction of Brother James Loxham, the Salve choirs will perform a wide selection of songs including, "This is My Country," "Just Dreamin'," "I Cielie Immersi," "One Land, One Heart" and "Come Again." Stephen Erickson will serve as the choirs' accompanist.

Tickets for the concert are \$2.00 and may be purchased at the Army Advisor's Office at the Naval War College, Rogers High School's ROTC Office and in Salve Regina's O'Hare Lobby and Cecilia Hall.
