THE WOMAN CONNECTION

A two-day conference titled, "The Woman Connection" will be held in Ochre Court on Wednesday, February 19 and Thursday, February 20. The conference, co-sponsored by members of Salve's faculty and staff, will explore the personal and social transformation of women in the 1980s.

Numerous speakers who are prominent counselors, religious leaders, educators and professionals will address a variety of topics.

Dr. Nancy Blackman, an associate professor in URI's Human Development Department, will speak on "Baby Doll or Barbie Doll: Issues of Early Female Sexuality." Her presentation will be a speculative essay on the early developmental sexual issues for the growing girl. Lynn Heufelder is the executive director of the Women's Resource Center of Newport County. She will speak and show a film - "Battered Women: Behind Closed Doors." Some of the other topics include "Women and the New Technologies", "Feminine Spirit and Imaginal Consciousness" and "Women in Transition."

The final presentation will be "You Can Get There From Here" by Rhode Island Secretary of State Susan Farmer.

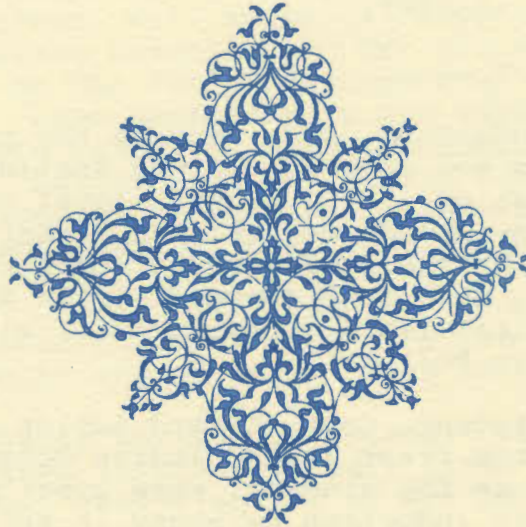
