SYMPOSIUM ON CONSCIOUSNESS

The Holistic Counseling Department will sponsor a one-day symposium entitled "Adventures in Consciousness: Whole Brain/Future Brain," on Saturday, February 14. The symposium will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the O'Hare Academic Center. Cost will be \$20.00 per person. Lunch is not included.

Led by a teacher, an academician, a clinician and a researcher, symposium participants will explore the horizons of consciousness by looking at the latest research on the brain and its varied functions. Also examined will be the possibility of expanding ways of favoring right and left brain use through bio-feedback and other state-of-the-art technological equipment.

Presenters at the one-day symposium will include Dr. Jack Childs, Director of the Human Development Graduate Program; Dr. James Hersh, Professor of Philosophy at Salve Regina; Beverly Serabian, a licensed clinical psychologist and an instructor in Salve Regina's Holistic Counseling Program; and Randi Strickland, a former NASA engineer who has five years of experience in brain/mind research and hemisphere lateralization.
